Duty of Disclosure Agreement**

Prospective Adoptive Parent(s), _____ were informed of their duty to disclose. Prospective Adoptive Parent(s) have each been informed and understand that under penalty of perjury it is their duty to disclose all information under 8 CFR 204.311(d) and are aware that they must notify their home study preparer and USCIS of any new event or information that might warrant submission of an amended or updated home study. They have also been advised that their duty to disclose is ongoing while form I-800A is pending, after form I-800A is approved, and while any form I-800A is pending until there is a final decision admitting the child to the U.S. on a visa.

Have you ever been arrested and fingerprinted, in the U.S. or overseas, even if the record was sealed, pardoned, expunged, or the subject of any other amelioration?

Have you ever received treatment for alcohol abuse?

Have you abused illegal controlled substances or prescription drugs?

Have you ever had any involvement with domestic violence or sexual abuse? (not as a victim)

Do you have a history with child protective services in the U.S. or overseas?

Has Immigration ever refused you visa clearance?

Have you ever been rejected as a prospective adoptive parent?

Have you ever been the subject of an unfavorable home study?

Have you ever transferred or received permanent custody of a child outside of the state/local authorities or outside of the state/local process?

Have you ever relinquished custody of a child?

Have you ever been determined to be partially or fully mentally incapacitated by any court?

Have you ever previously had a home study completed, or began the home study process in relation to an adoption (domestic or intercountry) or any form of custodial care, whether or not it was completed?
